## Technical Capabilities & Implementation

In spring 2019, the City of Tigard will install photo enforcement at the three intersections – 72nd Avenue, Hall Boulevard, and Durham Road – along Pacific Highway.

Conduent will provide the equipment and support services for photo enforcement. Violations are captured using photographs and video, along with other relevant data associated with the violation. A Tigard Police officer will verify the accuracy of each red-light violation and issue a citation to the driver where applicable.

The technology for photo enforcement uses radar vehicle detection. The technology can track up to 128 objects at a time and measures vehicle speeds through intersections, identifying vehicles traveling faster than the posted speed limit.

In 2017, Oregon passed legislation, which allows photo enforcement for speeding violations. Tigard has decided to implement the red-light violation monitoring at launch and activate the speeding enforcement technology at a later time.

### Implementation Timeline

- There will be a 30-day warning period once the equipment is operational. This allows drivers to receive a warning, rather than a citation for red light violations.
- After 30 days, citations for red-light violations will be issued. Initially only red-light violations will be cited however it is the intent to activate the component that includes speed violations at a later time.
