5.20.010 Review Of Applications.

Review of all new liquor license applications and annual renewal applications shall be made by the Tigard Chief of Police. Applications for all reviews shall be made thirty days prior to initial use or expiration date of licenses. (Ord. 87-72 §1(part), 1978).

5.20.020 Temporary Liquor License-- Time Limitation.

Application for all temporary liquor licenses shall be made to the Chief of Police. All temporary liquor licenses shall be in effect for not more than one twenty-four-hour period. (Ord. 87-72 §1(part), 1987; Ord. 78-25 §2, 1978).

5.20.040 Appeal Process.

In the event the Chief of Police issues a recommendation of denial to the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC), he shall first notify the applicant in writing of his intent to issue a recommendation of denial within three working days of receipt of the application. The notification shall include the reason(s) for the intent to recommend denial and a date and time within the next five working days to hear the applicant's appeal, if any. The applicant shall have the right to be heard and to present witnesses and evidence purporting to refute the reasons given by the Chief of Police for a recommendation of denial. The hearing shall be administrative in nature and held before the Chief

of Police. Rules of evidence shall not apply. Upon completion of the hearing, the Chief of Police shall make a finding and shall mail the final recommendation to the OLCC and the applicant within three working days of the hearing date. (Ord. 87-71 §1 (part), 1987).■
