Take the time to play and make some new memories this season!





SWIM LEVEL LESSON DESCRIPTIONS

PRESCHOOL	<i>For 3 and 4 year olds. Works on water adjustment and introduces floats, glides and movement across the pool.</i>
LEVEL 1	<i>Helps students feel comfortable in the water and learn to float on front and back independently.</i>
LEVEL 2	<i>Adds arms and rolling from front to back floats.</i>
LEVEL 2½	<i>Builds upon fundamentals and introduces the crawl stroke breathing pattern.</i>
LEVEL 3	<i>Improves the front crawl and adds breaststroke while swimming in deeper water.</i>
LEVEL 3½	<i>Proficient front and back crawl and refines the breaststroke. Introduces the butterfly.</i>
LEVEL 4	<i>Builds confidence in all strokes and improves other aquatic skills.</i>
LEVEL 5	<i>Provides further refinement of strokes and introduces the philosophy of exercise conditioning.</i>
LEVEL 6	<i>Geared toward the proficient swimmer, wanting to swim greater distances faster.</i>
