Tigard Police Investigating Homicide

On Friday, January 30, 2015 at approximately 5:45 p.m. Tigard Police were called to an area of SW 107th and Canterbury Lane in Tigard on reports of shots fired and a disturbance call. Tigard officers quickly located a gunshot victim lying outside a garage located at the Canterbury Heights Condominiums. Upon finding the victim, a Tigard officer began to administer life-saving chest compressions. The victim, 37 year-old Jerry Duy Nguyen, was pronounced deceased at the scene.

Nguyen was shot outside the Tigard home of his ex-wife. Nguyen was at the home to pick up his child when he was allegedly shot by a friend of his ex-wife. The child was inside the home during the incident however the incident was witnessed by the child's mother.

Tigard Police as well as numerous officers from neighboring agencies swarmed the area in hopes to contain a suspect who was observed running from the scene. A K-9 track led police to an apartment complex down the street from the shooting. Throughout the evening police were contacting residences in the area in efforts to locate the suspect. Many residents in the area had to delay their return home until police could conclude their search. Those same residents were allowed to return home later in the evening being escorted by Tigard Police.

Tigard Police investigators are focusing their attention on a possible suspect, 29 year-old Orlando Lee Pouncey, who maintains a residence relatively close-by to where the shooting incident took place. Police do not yet know what circumstances led up to the shooting.
