

New Burnham Street Gets Sustainable!

The City of Tigard and Kodiak Pacific Construction are committed to sustainable design and construction practices. Here are a few examples from the *New Burnham Street* project:

- ✓ Naturally landscaped areas provide onsite stormwater treatment, improve water quality and protect local streams.
- ✓ Burnham Street sidewalks and pedestrian amenities make walking an attractive alternative to driving.
- ✓ Connections to the Commuter Rail station in downtown Tigard encourage use of public transportation.
- ✓ Innovative design and construction features promote sustainability:
 - Sidewalk construction avoided removal of several large trees.
 - Cleared trees are recycled as wood chips for paper or “hog fuel” for the generation of electricity.
 - Old asphalt is recycled and reused in new asphalt mixes.
 - Wood from the only Sequoia removed was recycled into a bench to be placed in the upgraded Ash Street Dog Park.
