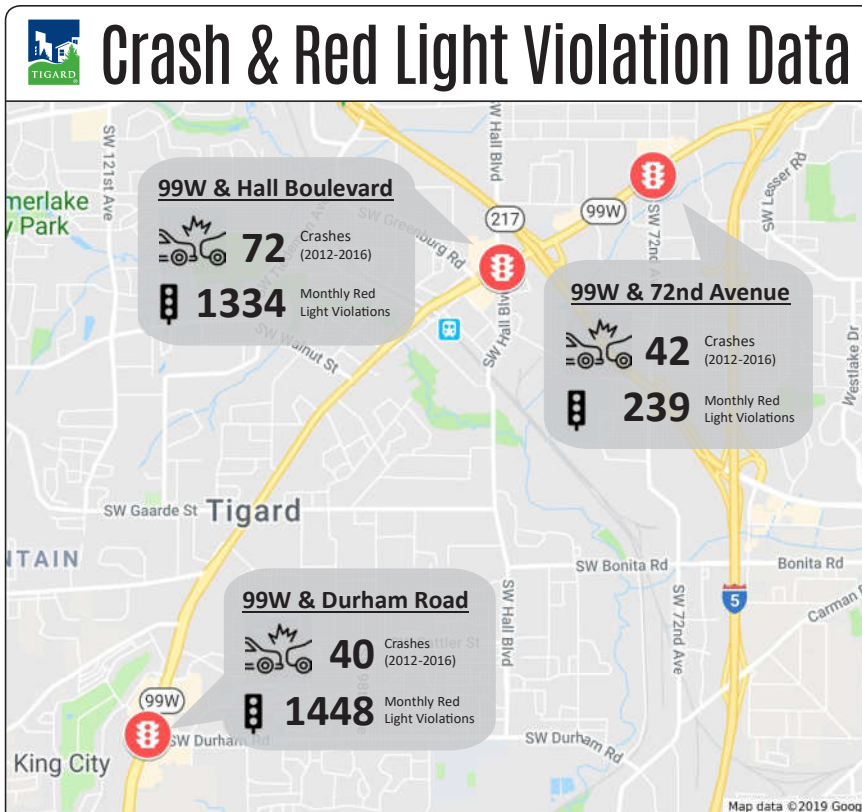

Background

In spring 2019, the City of Tigard will install photo traffic enforcement at the three intersections – 72nd Avenue, Hall Boulevard and Durham Road – along Pacific Highway.



The city is using photo enforcement to make intersections along Pacific Highway safer for drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists. The intersections for photo traffic enforcement were selected based on multiple factors, including:

- **Volume** – 139,900 vehicles traveled through the intersections daily between 2016 and 2017.
- **Violations** – An estimated 3,000 red-light violations occur monthly at the intersections.
- **Crashes** - 154 accidents occurred at the three intersections from 2012-2016.

A 30-day warning period will begin once cameras are installed at the intersections. Drivers who commit a red-light violation during this period, will receive a warning. Citations will be issued for red-light violations after the end of the warning period.
